## **Tashlich Service**

To prepare for Tashlich, gather some rocks, pebbles or shells. Don't use bread because it harms the fish and birds that eat it. Go to the edge of the water with your rocks or shells and recite the following passages.

Visualize the negativity of those habits that you want to remove, and place them in the stones or shells. One by one, say to yourself what is the negativity you want to remove, "put" it into the stone or shell, and throw it into the water. The Water is a cleansing agent. Let go of the negativity. Be done with it. And remove the negativity from your life. Take a few minutes to let it sink in, and begin the New Year with new hope, direction and purpose.

## **Reverse Tashlich**

None shall hurt or destroy in all My holy mountain, for the knowledge of that which is truly Divine shall fill the earth, as the water fills the sea. - Isaiah 11:9

We have cast our personal sins into the water. Now let's take out the "sins" created by humans. As we have entered the new year with pure hearts and good intentions, let's look at the other "sins" in the water\* and fulfill the Mitzvah of Bal Tashchit, the prohibition against needless waste and destruction. [\*For those not at a waterfront location replace this with "let's look at the other sins that could make their way to the water."]

After your team leader has explained everything about the Reverse Tashlich Cleanup, start removing the human sins that are polluting the water and, just as we cast off our own negativity, continue to do so as you remove the sins of humanity.

With each plastic bottle you collect, ask yourself: How many plastic bottles have I used in the past year? Resolve to use a reusable bottle.

With each plastic fork, knife or spoon that you collect, ask yourself: How many pieces of single-use plastic cutlery have I used in the past year? Resolve to utilize reusable cutlery.

With each plastic shopping bag you find, ask yourself: How many single-use plastic shopping bags have I taken in the past year? Resolve to use reusable shopping bags.

With every snack bag you find, ask yourself: How many snacks have I eaten from bags like these during the past year? Resolve to start eating healthier for you and the Planet. Choose fresh fruits that aren't wrapped in plastic.



With every cigarette butt, every piece of styrofoam, every piece of microplastic that you find, resolve to raise your voice to promote change within your community. [Microplastics are the tiny plastic fragments you'll see almost everywhere you look. They are the most dangerous of all plastic pollution.]
