
Before the Event

Your community will only appear after your team leader has signed up for the Reverse Tashlich on Repair the Sea website, then create a Golden template.


There are a few ways of searching for your community. Either the search bar, the map feature, or by tags.

2As you collect items, make tally marks in the space provided next to each item. If you find many of the same item, it's okay to tally around the name or elsewhere on the

sheet—just be sure it's clear which item each tally corresponds to.

3Once you've finished collecting, count the tally marks for each item and enter the final number in the TOTAL column. Do not write anything other than the number—please avoid using symbols (like "+" or "-"), ranges, or phrases like "too many."

Choose one person from your group—such as a team leader or designated volunteer—to be responsible for uploading your debris data to your Golden account.


Volunteers should hand their completed data sheets to this designated person. That person will then log into the Golden Dashboard and enter the collected debris data under the "Impact Data" (also known as "Footprints"):

- Number of bottles collected
- Number of plastic bags

- Number of food wrappers
- Etc.


This data helps everyone measure and celebrate collective progress.
